He also referred to various amendments in the B.Tech. (Dairy Technology) curriculum as per fifth Deans' Committee report. He counselled the students to be a thorough dairy professional.



The Guest of Honour of the function Dr. M. K. Jhala, Associate Director of Research, Anand Agricultural University, Anand delivered a lecture on "life skill

for higher education and stress management". He spoke on existing challenges and new challenges of today's digital world. He also quoted that one need to harness the good and minimize the damage of this digital and internet era. He also emphasized on key life skill namely thinking skill and social skill. He advocated the students to consider examination process as a 'Eustress' factor.



Dr. B. G. Patel, Provost, Charotar University of Science and Technology, Changa, expressed his pleasure on addressing the effectiveness of current examination system, changes to be made and how the students can be inculcated. He said



that examination system must change in such a way that it can produce students that are educated, well trained, skilled and competent. He also pointed out that it is the teachers' responsibility to create curiosity in the students and prompt them to raise questions. He also pointed that teaching becomes complete only if it becomes understanding and in order to inoculate scientific temper in the students, learning need to arouse curiosity, capacity building and query in them. He remarked that India need to emphasize on research and innovations for the social well-being. He urged the young audience to work hard with a clear view about future career and warned them that 'Hard work will beat talent if talent does not work hard'. He emphasized on the importance of professionalism and significance of commitment, ethics and urge towards excellence.
