Annual Report of NSS Activities Carried Out During the year 2022-23

(1) Vyasana Mukti Divas Celebration

As a part of “AZADI KA AMRUT MAHOTSAV” a Vyasana Mukti awareness rally was organized by FPT&BE, AAU, Anand at Vadod village of Anand Taluka on May 31, 2022. The professors, volunteers and 1st year NSS students from Food Processing Technology and Bio Energy College of Anand Agricultural University decided to start the year 2022 on a positive note by highlighting the importance of “Vyasana Mukti awareness”. They organised a rally in which about 45 students and professors actively participated. The students made various posters with slogan emphasising the importance of reducing consumption of tobacco, bidi, cigarette, alcohol etc., and having a healthy lifestyle.

The students filled with vigor and enthusiasm reached the Vadod village Gate with their slogans raised at 4:20 pm. From there the students went towards the Vadod village calling out captivating slogans such as “cigarette bidi, narak ni sidi”, “Daaru no batlo, mot no khatlo”, “yahi sandesh pahuchana hai, Nashe Ko dur bhagana hai”. The people came out of their houses drawn by the enthusiasm and passion of the youthful cheers. All the student had arranged themselves in a circle and grabbed the attention of villagers with slogans and performed the drama regarding Vyasana Mukti awareness. The rally ended at the bus stop at 5:25 pm, with great success and the students and professors achieved their aim to spread the message of "Vyasana Mukti awareness".



(2) Fit India Freedom Rider Cycle Rally

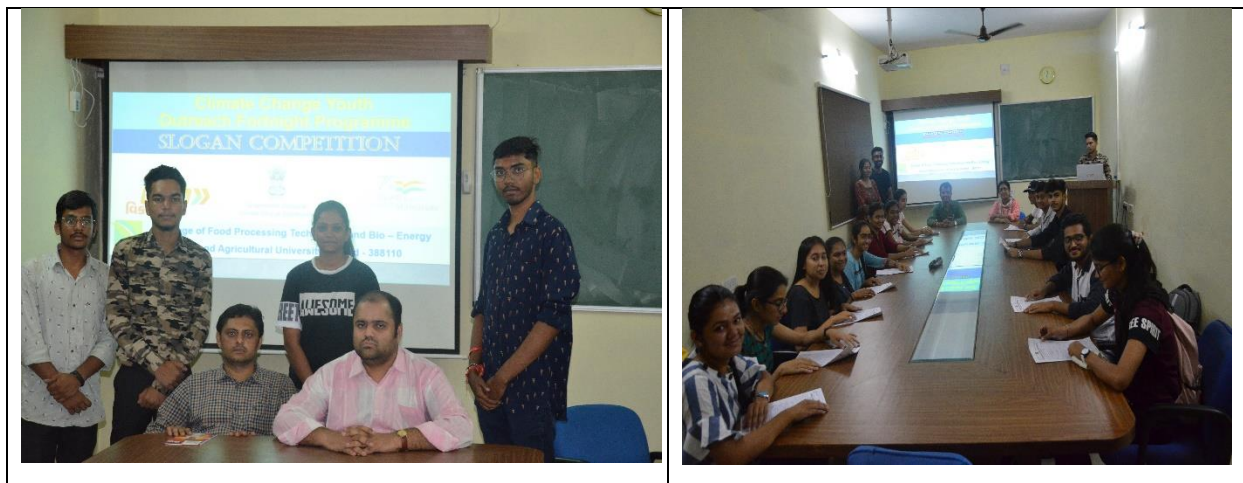

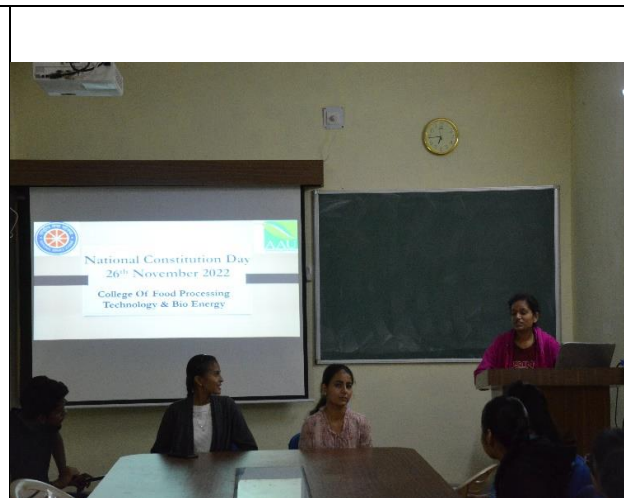


(13) Celebration of Constitution Day

The government of India declared 26th November as Constitution Day on 19th November 2015 by a gazette notification. The prime minister of India Narendra Modi made the declaration on 11th October 2015 while laying the foundation stone of the Dr. B. R. Ambedkar's statue of equality memorial in Mumbai. The year of 2022 was the 132nd birth anniversary of Dr. Ambedkar, who had chaired the drafting committee of the constituent assembly and played a pivotal role in the drafting of the constitution. Previously this day was celebrated as Law Day. 26th November was chosen to spread the importance of the constitution and to spread thoughts and ideas of Dr. Ambedkar.

For the Special Camp, Er. A. N. Nakiya, Programme Officer, NSS was visited the village before commencing of the camp and met Sarpanch of the village, ward members and other influential members of the community. Also NSS Officer met the principle of Thamna Educational Institute for the night stay of Volunteers during the whole NSS Camp. The plan of organizing the special

camp was discussed at the village. The plan and its utility were appreciated by the Sarpanch and other members of the village and they agreed for the camp to be organized. After the confirmation, a meeting with NSS volunteers was arranged on 20th February, 2023. In this meeting a brief presentation was made to the volunteers and plan for the camp was discussed. The volunteers excitingly participated in the discussion and planned the road map for camp along with guided supervision of NSS Program Officer.

Major Activities Undertaken During Special Camp 2023

Day 1: Cleanliness Drive and Rally

The day 1 of NSS Camp comprised of bunch of programmes like NSS song, NSS clap, cleanliness, Rally on cleanliness and Ratri shabha. The volunteers were guided by campus ambassadors Gohil Adhirajsinh and Parmar Niyati. Five groups were created which comprised of ten volunteers and one of the volunteer from each group was assigned as a leader to monitor the activities of the group and co-ordinate with other members of the group. The day 1 commenced with NSS Song and followed by NSS clap. Then we started to clean Thamna education institute, Thamna. Volunteers cleaned the ground, cultural hall and rooms. All the volunteers collected plastics bags, paper and leaves, etc.

After that the volunteers took slogan boards and marched around the Thamna village. The rally started at 5:00 pm. The rally was regarding reducing the use of plastic and of cleaning of village and residential area. Under the programme of Swatch Bharat Abhiyan, the volunteers chanted slogans like, “**Swachh Bharat, Swasth Bharat**”, “**Ek Do Teen Char... Safai ke liye ho Taiyar**”, etc. and spread awareness among the villagers. Rally got completed with NSS clap.

At 7:30 pm volunteers had their dinner near the cultural hall. Then there was a **Ratrisabha** with NSS officer Er. A N Nakiya, in which he motivated the volunteers and the volunteers shared their experience about the day and as the end was approaching, there was a sense of satisfaction on the faces of volunteers as the work was completed on time. The Day one programme ended successfully.





Day 2: Fit India, Poster Making, Survey and Wall Painting

The day 2 of NSS camp in Thamna comprised of various programmes like NSS Song, NSS clap followed by wall painting, survey, poster making. The day started with Yoga at 7:00 am and after completion of yoga, at 8:00 am all the volunteers took breakfast. Afterwards poster making held at 9:00 am in the morning in which students divided themselves into group of four and made posters on the topic “cow based organic farming”. The students performed their tasks efficiently. They all were satisfied on completing their designated tasks.

At 12:30 pm, all the volunteers headed towards the cultural hall for lunch. After having their lunch, the volunteers assembled at the hall for wall painting and survey. The volunteers then proceeded towards conducting a survey in the village of Thamna. The volunteers were divided in the seven groups of seven members each. The volunteers’ whole heartedly interacted with the people residing there and also give solution to their problems. Through the entire survey we were supposed to know as well as acknowledge them about the organic farming, milling operation, dairy technology, etc. Survey was all about addressing various problems faced by farmers or common people. Survey last for about two hours. Survey was done to find and understand the basic problem and needs of the villagers. There was a good interaction with the villagers by the volunteers. During survey NSS volunteers got very useful information regarding education, sanitation, anganwadis, religious places, play grounds for children, major health problems in the village etc.

Afterwards NSS volunteers conducted wall painting on the topic of public awareness. All the students actively took part and painted the wall beautifully with their skills.

At 7:30 pm, all the volunteers headed towards cultural hall for dinner after having dinner, there was a Ratrisabha conducted for the presentation of the poster making. Also students elaborated knowledge of others through the presentation. The day was pretty satisfactorily summed up as all the tasks were completed in designated time. And at last day 2 programme ended successfully.





Day 3: Fit India and Tree Plantation

The day 3 of NSS camp in Thamna was headed by College of FPT&BE NSS Program officer Er. A. N. Nakiya, comprised of various programmes like NSS Song, NSS clap followed by tree plantation. The day started with yoga and meditation at 7:00 am and all the volunteers actively performed it. After that all took breakfast and got ready for the visit towards a farm of one of the villager where chilly was grown. There the Volunteers got the knowledge of the chilly farming from the farmer. In temple, the volunteers assembled into their groups to play a game of “Talent Show”. The volunteers actively participated in the game along with the NSS Programme officer. At 12:30 pm all the volunteers took lunch and took rest. Afterwards tree plantation activity was held with the main chief guest of this event, Mr Mehulbhai, teacher of Thamna Educational Institute. In the tree plantation programme, all the volunteers of our college planted trees around the ground of Thamna education institute. One by one students performed the programme. At 7:30 pm, all the volunteers headed towards cultural hall for dinner after having dinner, in Ratrisabha there was a debate conducted on the topic “impact of social media” and students actively took part and discussed about the benefits and harm of social media on today’s generation. With this day-3 programme ended successfully.





Day 4: Road Safety Drive and Lecture on Road Safety to Primary School Students of Thamna Educational Institute

The day 4 of NSS camp in Thamna comprised of various programmes like NSS Song, NSS clap followed by road safety rally and cleanliness. At first, the day started with meditation and yoga and after that volunteers clean the surrounding of the Thamna education institute and during this, some of volunteers went for giving important lecture on Road Safety to students of STD-9 of Thamna Educational Institute.

At 12:30 pm all headed towards cultural hall for lunch. After some time, all the volunteers took banners and posters with them and started rally around the village. All the volunteers actively participated and chanted slogans on the road safety like “DRIVE SLOWLY, DRIVE SAFELY”, “SAFETY IS IMPORTANT”, and actively participated in the rally and thus spread awareness among the villagers. And after completion of the rally, in the evening all the volunteers played different types of games such as Cricket, Badminton, Volleyball, Hide and Seek etc.

At 7:30 all headed towards cultural hall for dinner. After some time, at Ratrisabha few of the volunteers prepared speech on the topics like “G20”, “Millet Year”, and thus enlightened others about the same to others. And thus their speeches were very informative and also some of the students shared their experience of Mt. Abu camp, Hyderabad camp etc. Thus day 4 programme ended successfully.



Day 5: Nasha Mukti and cleanliness

The day 5 of NSS camp in Thamna comprised of various programmes like cleanliness, Nasha mukti rally, Drama on nasha mukti, etc. The day started with yoga and meditation at 7:00 am. After that volunteers took breakfast.

Afterwards the volunteers went to Health Centre of the Thamna village where they cleaned the surrounding and herbal garden of the Health Centre, they also collected leaves, branch etc. After completion, the volunteers went at Thamna Educational Institute for giving information about Anand Agricultural University and our FPT&BE college. At 12:30 pm all the volunteers took their lunch.

Volunteers carried out a rally around 4:00 pm on nasha mukti in which they prepared posters and banners on the same. Thus, the rally was carried out around the village with the chanting of slogans like, “Ek do... ek do... nashe ki lat ko chhod do” , “Bidi nark ni sidi” and “Daaru no batlo mot no Khatlo”, etc and in the middle part of the village the volunteers conducted a drama in which they beautifully showed that why we should not take any alcoholic things that can ruin our lives. Thus, the volunteers spread awareness among the villagers about nasha mukti.

Day 6: Cyber Crime Awareness and Point of view

The day 6 of NSS camp in Thamna was headed by NSS program officer, comprised of program on awareness about cybersecurity etc. The day started with the same routine of performing yoga and meditation. Then the volunteers took their breakfast. The volunteers actively participated in the different games and afterwards all the volunteers started preparing for the valedictory function which was on the next day. By 12:30 pm lunch had been taken by the volunteers.

He also cleared our doubts and thus the cybercrime program ended successfully with the NSS clap.

After that, at Ratrisabha volunteers were given different situations and were also asked to give their point of view on that situation and what they would do if they were in the same situation. Also some of the volunteers shared their life experiences and also motivational stories. With this day 6 of the camp ended successfully.





Day 7: Valedictory
