






Lecture on VEDA

Rakhi making



Why Special camp?

A special camp of NSS Volunteers was organized by College of Agricultural Information Technology, Anand Agricultural University, Aannd at Vadtal Ta. Nadiad, Dist. Aannd during 13/03/2024 to 22/03/2024. Total 50 Volunteers participated in this NSS special camp. Day 1-16/03/2024

The seven days special camp started on 16th March, 2024 by College of AIT, AAU, Anand at Vadtal village of Nadiad taluka. At 8:15 am NSS camp was falgoff by Y.R. Ghodsara, Pricipal & Dean, CAIT, AAU, Anand. We reached vadtal at 9:30 am. The stay for NSS volunteers was at Shree Hari sahjanand Bhuvan. They started with cleaning the place where they had to stay. All made themselves comfortable. Thereafter, they went to Swaminarayan temple and with the blessings of the god, they started the NSS camp. The NSS programme officer gave the information on the importance of NSS in life and after students started the NSS camp with NSS song & clapping.

After having Prashadi, volunteers divided themselves in groups and gathered information from the villagers about the village, like- anganvadi, school, health centre and students preparing social map of village and rapport with villagers and knowing problem faced by them. Thereafter, the report made by each group was presented. After the presentation, they all joined Aarti and had dinner at temple. Then, at night, all got together and shared their day experience and planned the upcoming day's activities.




































The day of NSS volunteers started by doing yoga and reciting sholkas. Yoga is an excellent approach to improve your flexibility and strength. After freshening up, the volunteers started the cleaning drive. They started cleaning the surrounding area of Gomti Ghaat, nearby Gaushala and hospital. They also cleaned plastic debris along the roadside.

Thereafter, they had Prasadi and prepared posters and slogans of different theme like Beti bachao, Beti padhao; save water, save plants, stop addition, dowry prohibition and voter awareness etc. After having dinner, at around 8:30pm, we all gathered at temple for Sayan Aarti.





























NSS day started with yoga. After freshening up, we took a visit to Gyaan baugh. There, they were shown things that were used by Shree Hari himself and also the detailed drawings on his life. Thereupon, we decided to visit the nearby Mahadev temple.

Then, 108 emergencies services Ranjitbhai Gohel, Pilot jayendrabhai bariya gave us information about 108 emergencies, including all machine tools and everything in ambulance contain. They showed us a live example for how to carry someone in stretcher while taking them to hospital. This programme was arranged in prathmik kanya shala and these students also joined in this session programme

Fire safety lecture was organized, from which Chiragbhai Gadhvi and Bharatbhai Barot gave us the basic knowledge related to fire safety equipments, how to operate the equipments, conditions in which the fire can broke out, who to take small measures related to stop fire and information gave emergencies number of fire safety. He also gave demo to stop fire with pressure of water.

In our Afternoon session, NSS volunteers gave lectures to kumar shals students on different subjects. Most important of this Kumar Shala was that name of this school was "Kumar Shala" and was managed by the lady teachers. This was the best example of women's empowerment. Then, all visited to Gomati Ghat and at night, all the volunteers get together and performed Gujarat's folk dance Garba.































Day 5-20/03/2024

As routine NSS volunteer's day starts with yoga, pranayam and suryanamshkar. March 20th, **World Sparrow Day** is observed, a yearly event dedicated to promoting the conservation of sparrows. World Sparrow Day is a global initiative that aims to raise public awareness of the importance of sparrows in maintaining ecological balance and biodiversity in cities and suburbs. Unfortunately, these birds are fast becoming extinct, and their populations are rapidly declining, so volunteers made sparrow houses and tied the bird houses in different locations and also distributed in village.

Voting is an integral part of democracy, and people must have a voice. Everyone has the right to vote, which means that all Indians can vote for the Prime Minister of their choice. To create awareness among the people/public/voters, volunteers were aware of people to vote.


















Day 6-21/03/2024
