

KVK Devataj Celebrated World Veterinary Day 2017

At outset Senior Scientist and Head of KVK Dr. G.G. Patel welcomed all the livestock farmers and gave a welcome speech. Dr. G.G. Patel asked livestock farmers to visit KVK regularly and get information on recent advancement in livestock farming. He also suggested farmers to go for scientific livestock farming for more profit. Dr. S.B. Katole, Scientist (Animal Science) discussed about the role of animal husbandry in economic welfare of the farmers. He told farmers how to take more production performance from livestock they have. Dr. Katole told the farmers about the theme of this year’s World Veterinary Day is “Antimicrobial Resistance - From Awareness to Action” and told farmers that veterinary doctors have a key player in the fight against antimicrobial resistance as they have a major role in regulating and supervising the use of antibiotics and giving professional advice to livestock farmers apart from collaborating with the human health sector.

Invited guest Dr. Bharat Patel told the farmers regarding household remedies for common disease conditions in animals. He told that regular deworming should be carried out to avoid parasitic infestation in animals. He also informed about the various schemes of State Government for livestock farmers such as subsidy on chaff cutter, milking machine, cattle shed, goat unit etc. He also aware farmers regarding various zoonotic diseases and how to avoid them. At last Mr. Y.C. Lakum, Scientist (Agronomy) proposed the vote of thanks. Total 40 livestock farm women and 10 livestock farmers from nearby villages have participated in this programme and all staff of KVK joined hands for success of this program.
