



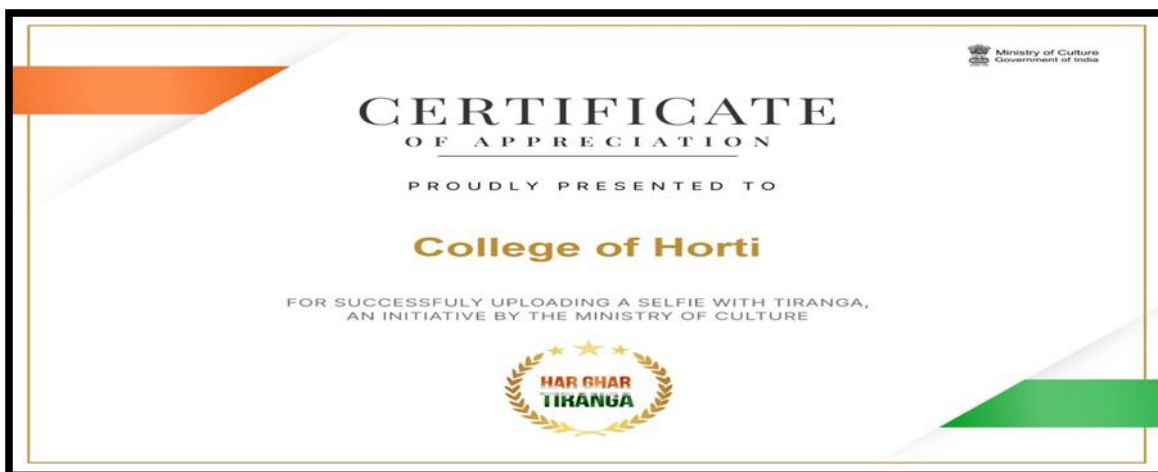
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“Har Ghar Tiranga”

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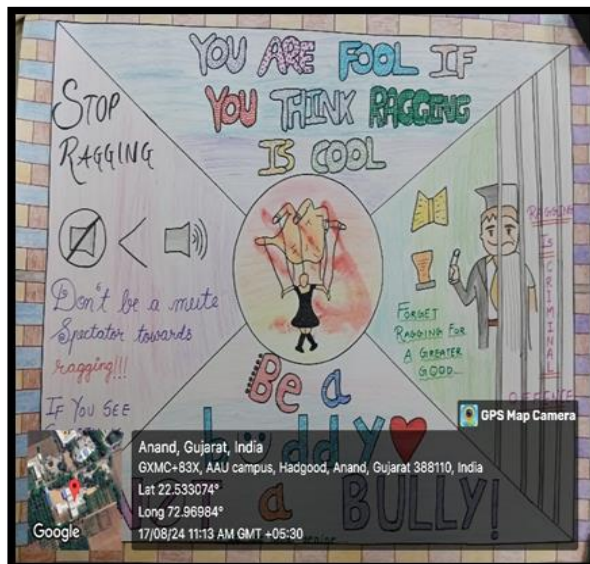


“Anti-Ragging”

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“National Space Day”

The College of Horticulture, AAU, Anand, hosted a live telecast of the National Space Day (NSpD) 2024 event, "Touching Lives While Touching the Moon - India's Space Saga," on August 23, 2024. Undavia, an Associate Professor at CMPICA, CHARUSAT. During the session, Dr. Undavia delivered a comprehensive lecture titled “Introduction to Cyber Security”. He provided invaluable insights into the various types of cyber-attacks that individuals might encounter in today's digital world. Dr. Undavia emphasized the potential sources of these threats, including phishing, malware and social engineering attacks. He further elaborated on the essential measures one should take to safeguard themselves while using digital platforms, highlighting the importance of strong passwords, recognizing suspicious emails and regularly updating software.

A total of 70 NSS volunteers participated actively in the program. The primary objective of this event was to raise awareness among students about the increasing cyber threats and to equip them with the necessary knowledge to protect themselves online. Dr. Undavia's session not only enlightened the volunteers about the current cybersecurity issues but also inspired them to adopt secure practices in their digital lives. Following the session, prizes were distributed to the winners of the previous poster competition on anti-ragging.

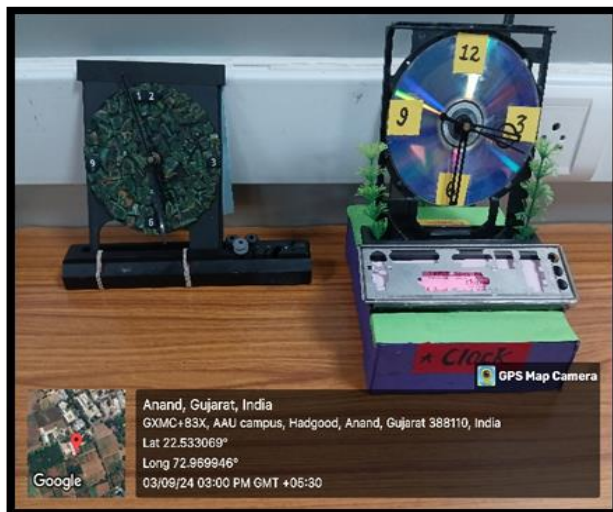

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“Swabhav Swachta Sanskar Swachta”

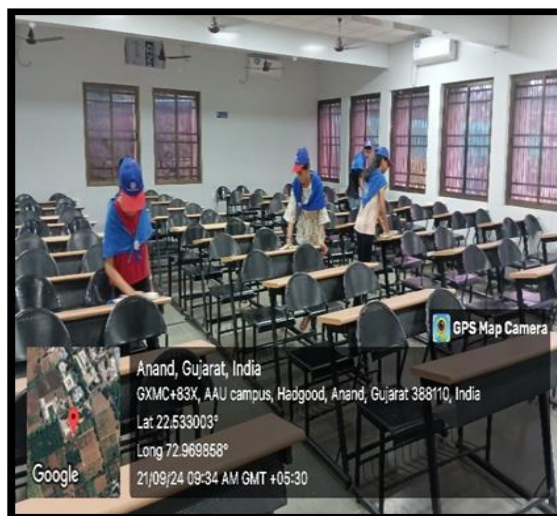

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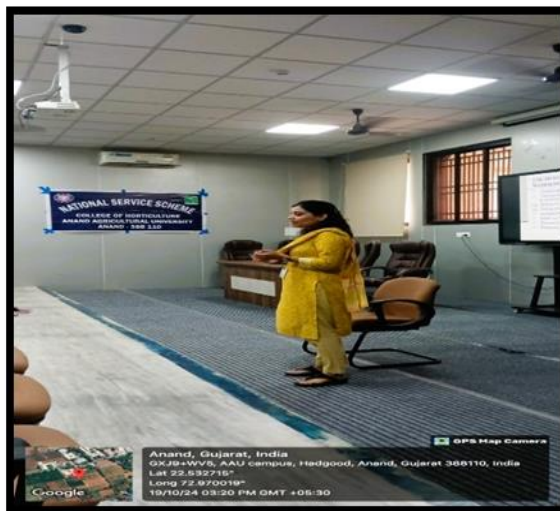
“Ergonomics and Physiotherapy: Protecting Your Health in the Digital Age”

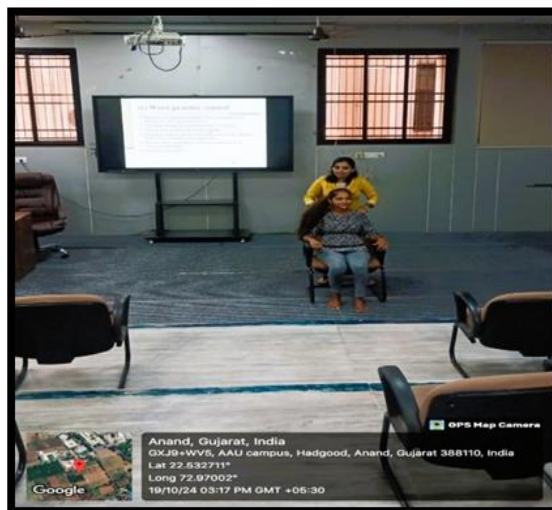
The College of Horticulture, AAU, Anand, conducted a program on "Ergonomics and Physiotherapy: Protecting Your Health in the Digital Age" on 19th October 2024 under the NSS Cell. The event, conducted under the guidance of Principal & Dean, Dr. N. I. Shah, aimed to raise awareness about the importance of maintaining physical well-being in the increasingly digital environment. The session began with an introduction by Dr. Prity Kumari, Program Officer of the NSS Cell, College of Horticulture, about the event and the guest speaker, Dr. Heta Patel, an Assistant Professor at ARP Institute of Physiotherapy, Charotar University of Science & Technology (CHARUSAT).

During the session, Dr. Heta Patel delivered an insightful lecture on the topic, providing valuable information on the principles of ergonomics and the importance of physiotherapy in preventing injuries related to prolonged digital device usage. Dr. Patel emphasized the common issues arising from poor posture and repetitive strain injuries, such as back pain, neck strain and carpal tunnel syndrome. She also provided practical advice on how to set up an ergonomic workspace, including the proper positioning of chairs, desks and screens, as well as the importance of taking regular breaks.

A total of 60 NSS volunteers participated actively in the program. The primary objective of the event was to educate students on how to protect their health while engaging in digital activities and to promote the adoption of good ergonomic practices. Dr. Patel's session raised awareness about the physical risks of excessive screen time and motivated the participants to implement healthy habits in their daily routines.

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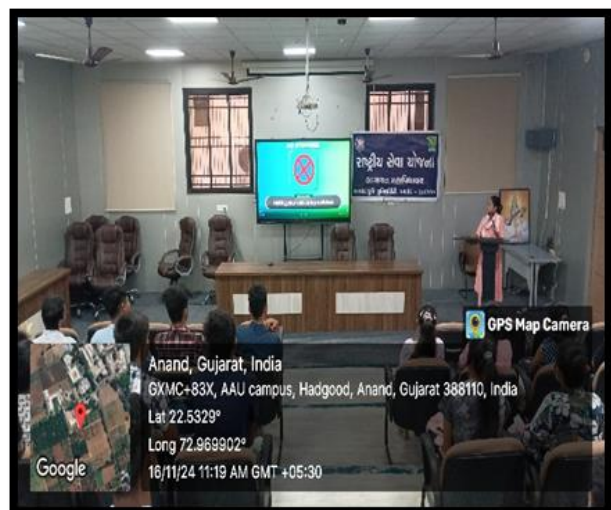
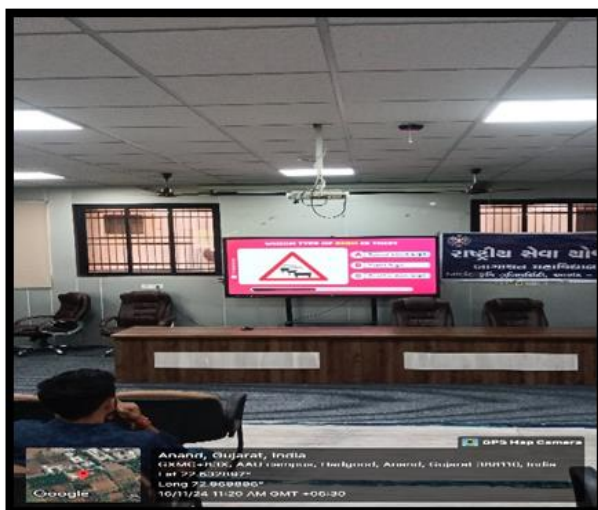
“Road Safety Awareness program”

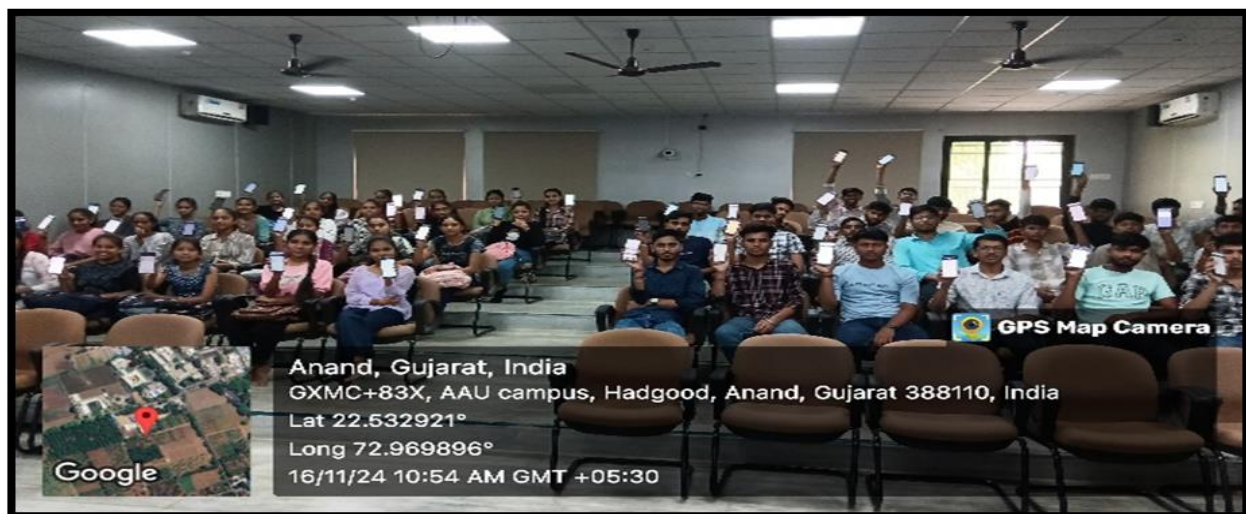
The College of Horticulture, Anand Agricultural University (AAU), organized a "Road Safety Awareness Program" on November 16, 2024, under the aegis of the NSS Cell. The event, conducted under the guidance of Principal & Dean, Dr. N. I. Shah, aimed to promote awareness about road safety and the importance of responsible behavior on the road. The session commenced with an insightful introduction by Dr. Prity Kumari, Program Officer of the NSS Cell, who emphasized the significance of road safety in preventing accidents and saving lives. Horticulture, actively participated in the quiz, demonstrating their keen enthusiasm.

The program concluded with a mass registration drive on "My Bharat Portal". Dr. Prity Kumari explained objectives of portal and provided step-by-step guidance for registration. Students were followed her to complete the process during the session, after which Dr. Kumari approved the registrations through her account.

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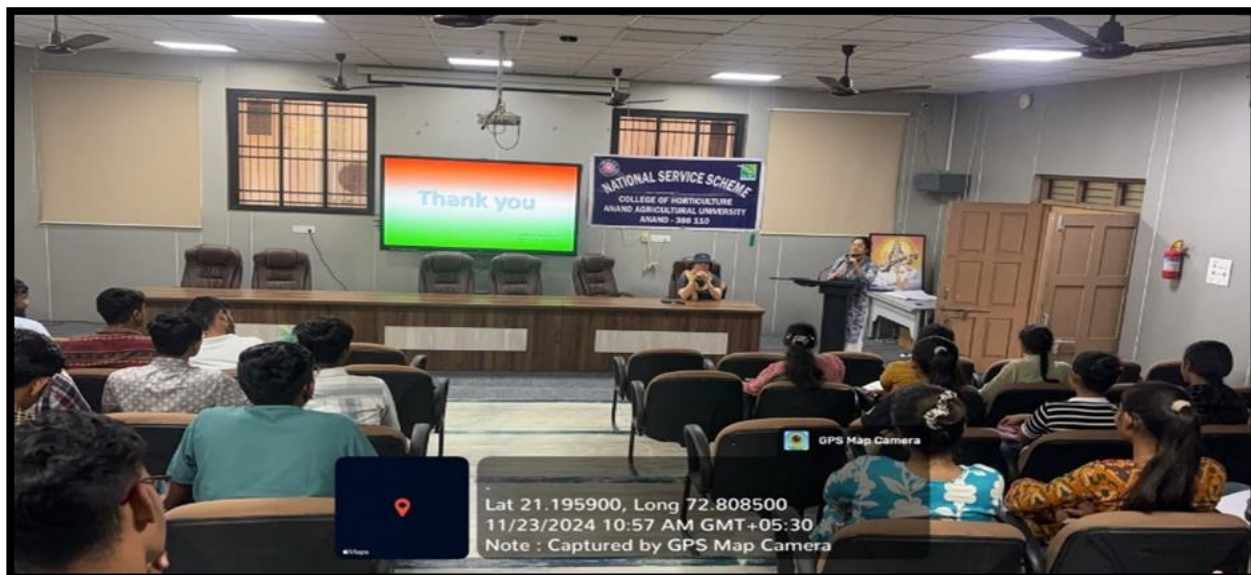


“Balanced Diet & Nutrition”

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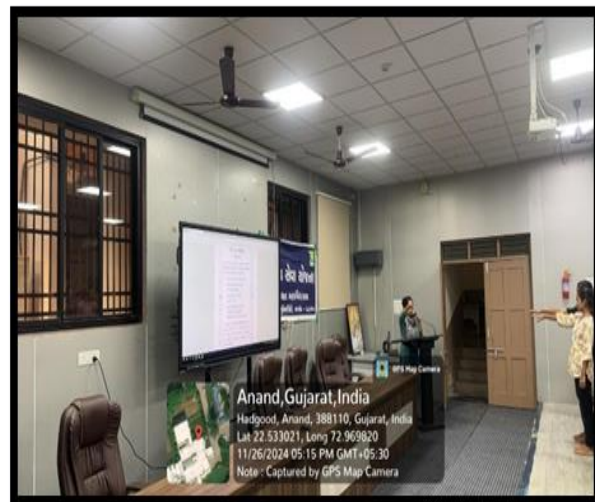


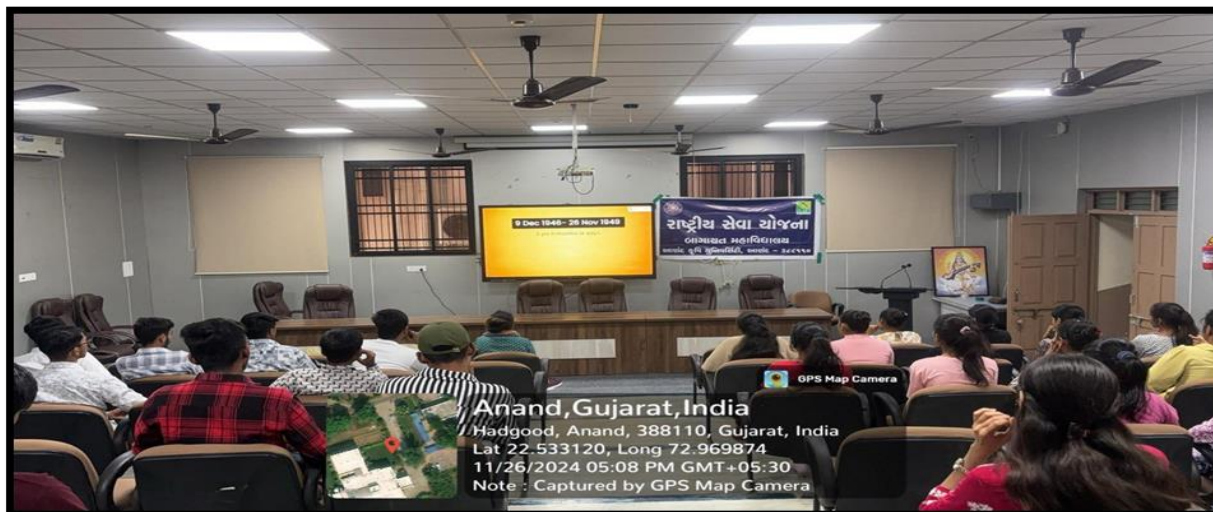


“Constitution Day of India”

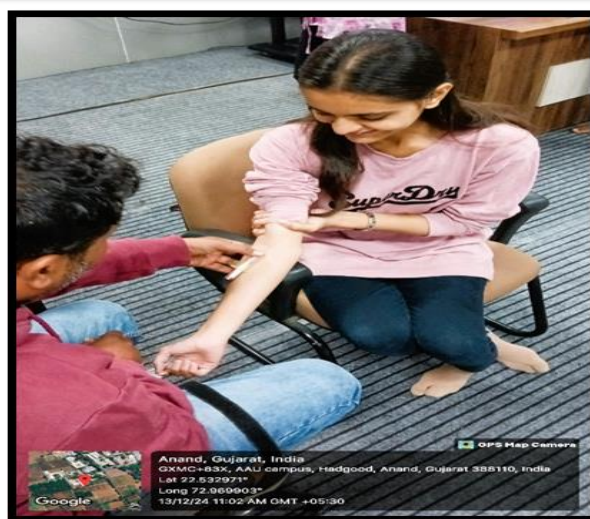
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“Thalassemia Awareness Programme”

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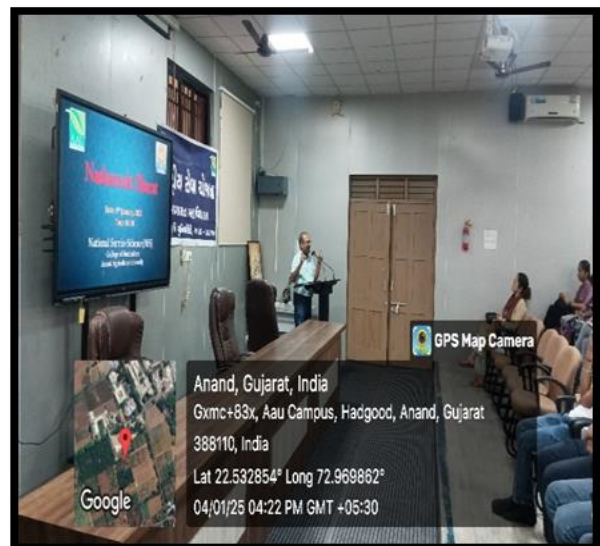


“Nashamukt Bharat”

Special Activities of NSS

SPECIAL CAMP – 24th February to 2nd March, 2025

At & Po: Pandoli, Taluka: Petlad, District: Anand, Gujarat

The NSS Special Camp organized by the College of Horticulture, Anand Agricultural University, was held from 24th February to 2nd March 2025 at Pandoli village, Petlad Taluka, Anand District. The camp commenced on Day-11 with a cleanliness drive at Jalaram Temple, followed by pot making, planter preparation, a tree plantation drive and team-building games. Day-2 began with a morning yoga session, after which the volunteers visited the medicinal and aromatic plant farm in Zarola and engaged in pen stand painting, pot designing and evening sports. The day concluded with temple shramdaan during dinner. On Day-3, the students performed yoga, visited cow fodder units, forest and vegetable farms, an old age home, strawberry and organic farms and the goshala and dairy farm in Zarola. They also planned the next day digital awareness program and participated in games and temple service. Day-4 included yoga, a village survey in Pandoli, an informative cybercrime session and digital awareness program plus they performed a street skit on better selection of leaders in front of villagers, alongside poster making, slogan writing and bird nest. On Day-5, the team cleaned the local primary school, conducted a tree plantation, prepared vertical garden, planters, for school and presented a skit during the closing ceremony, which also included speeches by the DSW AAU, Dr. D H Patel and Former block coordinator, Shri Hasmukhnhai Prajapati. Additional highlights included a snake bite awareness session and a paneer-making demonstration. Day-6 involved yoga, a visit to the greenhouse at Bochasan and a motivational lecture on de-addiction at BAPS Shri Swaminarayan Mandir, followed by gift-making and sports. 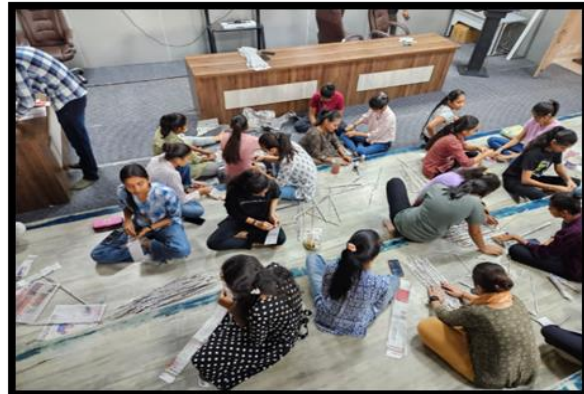
