Message

Livestock plays an important role in Indian economy with contribution of 4.11% to GDP and 25.6% to total Agriculture to GDP. Breeding, management and feeding are the three main pillars of profitable dairying, of which feeding plays a very crucial role. Adequate feeding will ensure that animal attains desired body weight, early pregnancy to produce more milk and remains healthy.

Animal husbandry in our country is



subsidiary to agriculture and mainly depends on feeding agriculture byproducts which can only sustain animals. Pasture grass is the only source of green fodder to majority of animals with insufficient quantity and only dairy animals get concentrate mixture while in lactating stage. There is total ignorance for supplementing mineral mixture to livestock. All together it leads to imbalanced feeding which cannot exploit full genetic potential of animals.

National Dairy Development Board has noted that ration balancing increases net daily income of farmers from ₹ 15 to 25 per animal through increase in milk and milk fat production. Extensive work has been carried out by Animal Nutrition Research Department of AAU for all the districts of Gujarat and in all three seasons to study nutritional status of different categories of dairy animals and has made recommendations for supplementing deficit nutrients through locally available feeds (Ration Balancing).

Similarly, the mineral status of different categories of animals has been studied and the minerals found deficient against their requirements were determined. Based on this information, recommendations have been made for Area Specific Mineral Mixtures. AAU is also manufacturing chelated mineral mixture and the same is being sold under the brand name of 'ANUBHAV MINERAL MIXTURE'.

The scientists at Animal Nutrition Research Department have also developed legume straw based feeding system which reduces methane emission from cattle and buffalo by 11%.

Efforts are also being made to develop technology for Solid State Fermentation of crop residues to enhance nutrient utilization, feed efficiency and production of ruminants. I am sure that the scientists will continue to explore new frontier areas in the field of Animal Nutrition to improve reproduction, production and health of livestock.

Release of Report during Annual Review Meeting of Outreach Project on Methane by Dr. N.C. Patel, Hon. VC, AAU

Methane is one of the potent green house gases and ruminant animals contribute to 50% of total methane produced in our country. For mitigation of methane production in ruminant animals, ICAR has started outreach project on methane at various centers in the country under leadership of National Institute of Animal Nutrition & Physiology (NIANP), Bangalore. One of the centers is at Animal Nutrition Research Department, College of Veterinary Science & AH, AAU, Anand under the guidance and supervision of Dr. P. R. Pandya, Research Scientist & Head. The annual review meeting of the project for the year 2016-17 was held at AAU, Anand on 11 July 2017. Dr. B. Prakash, ADG (Animal Science) ICAR; Dr. Raghvendra Bhatta, Director, NIANP, Bangalore and Principal Investigators of all the centers attended the meeting. In the inaugural session, Director of Research, AAU, Dr. K. B. Kathiria warmly welcomeed the dignitaries and highlighted the work done by Anand Center. Dr. Bhatta highlighted the genesis of the project and gave brief account of over all work done so far. Dr. B. Prakash expressed gratitude for organizing annual review meeting at Anand and gave remarks on the work done and emphasized all the centers to carry out long term experiments on growing and lactating animals. After releasing the progress report of all the centers, Dr. N. C. Patel, Hon. VC, in his remarks, emphasized the importance of the project in context to natural calamities the world is facing due to climate change. He informed the house that more than 100 samples of feeds and fodder have been evaluated for in vitro methane production potential. Legume straw based Total Mixed Ration has been developed by AAU center which reduces methane production by 10 to 15% in cattle as well as in buffalo. He also opined that the scientists should come out with cost effective and farmer friendly

11™ ANNUAL NATIONAL LEVEL WORKSHOP ON PESTICIDE RESIDUES AT AAU, ANAND

The 11th annual workshop on Central Sector Scheme on Monitoring of Pesticide Residues at National Level was conducted on 22 September 2017 at AINP on Pesticide Residues, Anand Agricultural University, Anand.

Total 23 NABL 17025 accredited laboratories located in different parts of the country are operational in the project. The main aspect of the project is to study the consumer level exposure of pesticide residues in different food commodities. The delegates from different states of India participated in the workshop to discuss the annual progress report on status of pesticide residues in fruits, vegetables, cereals, pulses, spices, milk and other agricultural commodities grown in the respective states. The project is sponsored by Ministry of Agriculture, Cooperation and Farmer's welfare, Govt. of India, New Delhi.

The workshop was inaugurated by Dr. N. C. Patel, Hon. VC, AAU, Anand; in presence of Sh. Ashwani Kumar, Joint Secretary (PP), DAC, Krishi Bhavan, New Delhi; Sh. Sanjay Prasad, Principal Secretary (Agriculture and Co-operation Department), Govt. of Gujarat; Dr. B. S. Phogat, Additional Plant Protection Adviser (IPM), CIPMC, Faridabad; Dr. P. K. STATE LEVEL BIOSAFETY CAPACITY BUILDING WORKSHOP AT AAU, ANAND

A State level biosafety capacity building workshop under the UNEP/GEF Supported Phase II Capacity Building Project on Biosafety was jointly organized by Ministry of Environment, Forest & Climate Change (MoEF&CC), Government of India, New Delhi; Biotech Consortium India Limited, New Delhi; Anand Agricultural University & Department of Agriculture, GoG on 13 July 2017 at AAU, Anand.

The Inaugural session was chaired by Dr. N. C. Patel, Hon. VC, AAU. Dr. R.S. Fougat, Nodal Officer of the workshop greeted all the participants. Dr. K.B. Kathiria welcomed all the dignitaries and emphasized that GMOs are very much needed to break the yield plateau in many of the crops, so as to meet the ever increasing demand of food across the globe. Dr. Vibha Ahuja, Chief General Manager, BCIL introduced the objectives of the workshop and explained in brief, the biosafety regulations in India. Dr. Qureshi, Joint Director (Agriculture) stressed the need to create awareness among farmers who are actual end users of the technology. Dr. B. Sesikeran, Chairman, RCGM in his key note address, advocated the role of State Governments in GM regulation and informed that biosafety norms in India are most stringent and GM varieties are thoroughly tested for safety assessment. Dr. N.C. Patel, Hon. VC, in his opening remarks stated that 60-70% of country's population is dependent on agriculture, so we should have a comprehensive agricultural policy, including GM crops. He also briefed about the biotechnological research being carried out at AAU.

The Expert from premier institutes of country including Dr. B. Sesikeran Chairman, RCGM; Dr. Vibha Ahuja, Chief General Manager, BCIL; Dr. Celia Chalam, Principal Scientist, NBPGR, New Delhi delivered the lectures during the

workshop. The other distinguished speakers from Gujarat included Dr. R.S. Fougat, Prof. & Head, Dept. of Agril. Biotechnology, AAU, Anand; Dr. Chandermohan Singh, DGR-ICAR, Junagadh; Dr. Rajesh Patkar, MSU, Baroda; Dr. Pradeep. K. Agarwal, CSMCRI, Bhavnagar and Dr. R.S. Tomar, JAU, Junagadh.

All the experts further informed the delegates that, biosafety regulatory framework in India is very strong and safe which ensures very rigorous process for monitoring and approval of GMOs in the country and GM crop varieties are as safe as their non-GM counterparts.





