## BACA pay rich tribute to our national heroes on *Shaheed din*



- There is no greater sacrifice known to man/woman other than giving one's life for the nation
- Martyrs don't die they continue to live in our hearts as inspiration

As you are aware, 30th January is celebrated as Martyr's Day or *Shaheed Diwas* every year in the memory of Mahatma Gandhi and the sacrifice of three revolutionaries of India. On 30th January 1948, the 'Father of Nation' was assassinated, and on 23rd March, 1931 three national heroes, namely Bhagat Singh, Shivaram Rajguru, and Sukhdev Thapar, were hanged to death by the British rulers.

To commemorate the devotion, loyalty and dedication extended by our national icons and to have inspiration from their ideals, the students and faculties of B. A. College of Agriculture, AAU, Anand, jointly organized the tribute programme on *Shaheed Diwas* i.e. 30th January 2022 at 11.00 AM through virtual mode (Google Meet Platform). Dr. D. J. Parmar, Chairman, SRC and Dr. Vinaya Kumar HM, Member SRC outlined the details of programme and motivated the students. The Programme started with two minutes *Maun* - silence tribute to our national idols (11.00 AM to 11.02 AM), followed by introductory remarks by Dr. D. H. Patel, Director of Students Welfare 74<sup>th</sup> death anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi. Dr. Y. M. Shukla, Principal and Dean, B. A. College of Agriculture, AAU, Anand briefed about the contribution by father of nation Mahatma Gandhi and his thoughts on *Satya*, *Ahinsa* and *Aparigrah* (Non possessiveness). Shri Dhaval Savaliya, 8<sup>th</sup> semester student & General Secretary and Mili Patel, Girls Representative, coordinated the programme. A total of 10 students, namely Omdeep Zala, Raj Raval, Prachee Verma, Dhruv Patil, Payal Chudasama, Jahanvi Patel, Riya Jadav, Priyanka Parmar and Chauhan Keyur participated in the programme consisted of recitation of patriotic songs, delivery of the speech and performance - mono-acting.
