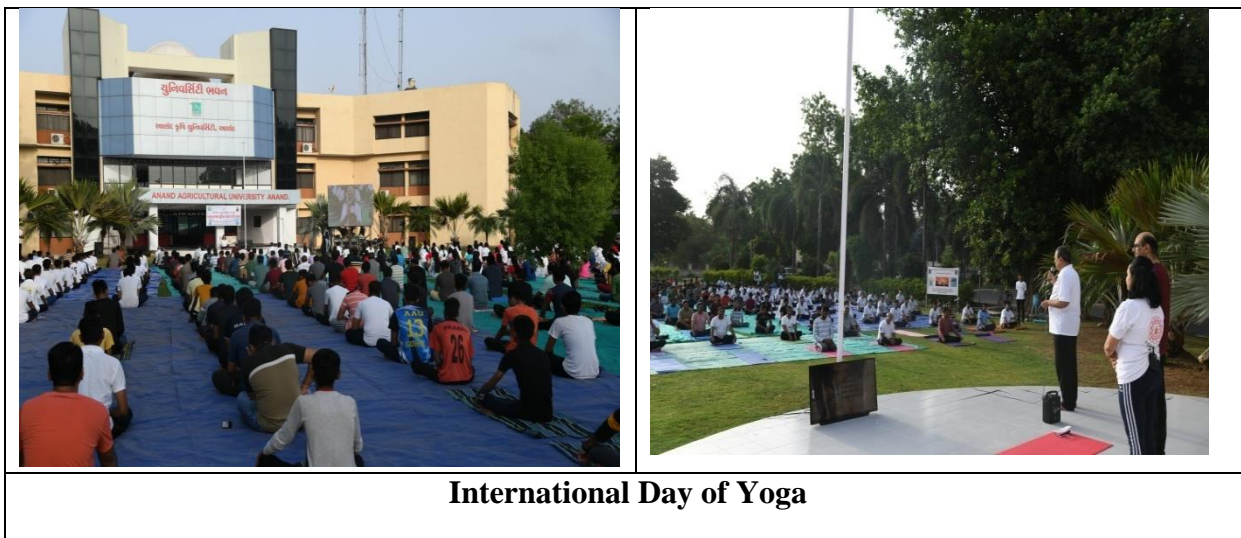
### (1) Yoga Camp

### **(3) Celebration of 76<sup>th</sup> Independence Day**

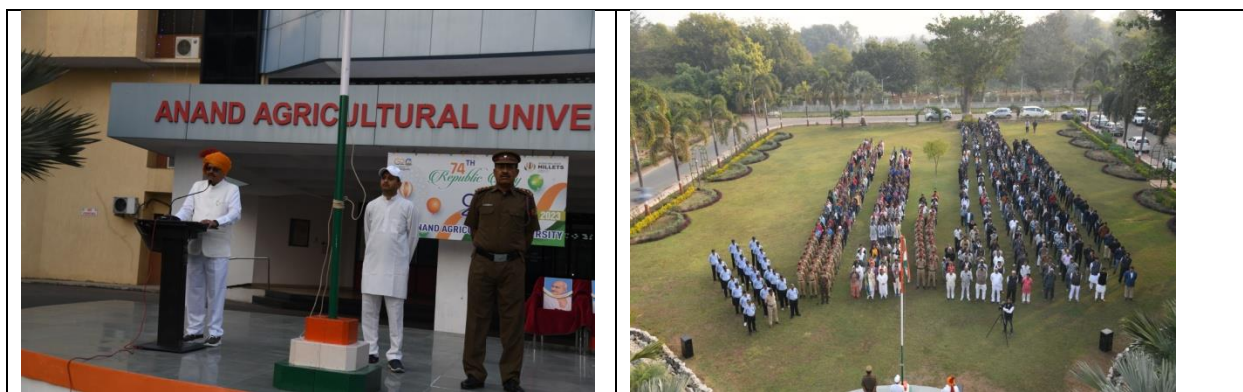
